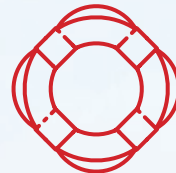

# President's Report

---

"2024/25 has been another huge year for Stockton SLSC!"



A Summer that saw the way we deliver patrols for the community change with more flexibility allowed in our patrolling numbers based on weather, surf conditions and member qualification coupled with changes to our patrolling hours. These changes saw our patrols target peak summer and known busier days of the season and allowed smaller patrol teams to deliver a more targeted service to our community. Congratulations and thank you to all our patrol Captains and your teams, and a special shout out to Tom Enright and Billy Bernard who both performed more than 200hrs each! Well done everyone.

Outstanding competition results and increased participation has definitely been a highlight for our club this season. Our masters men and women continue to punch above their weight bringing home a swag of medals at State and Aussies and the ladies also delivered on Gold Coast at the World Championships after a tuff winter of training. Our Surf Boat rowers numbers are increasing with our Female crews leading the way. Thank you to Greg Ross our Boat Sweep and Coach whose efforts this season saw him recognized as our clubs Volunteer of the year. But it is without a doubt our nippers that stole the show this season. Congratulations to Will Isedale, Sadie Upton and Stevie Robinson who all collected gold medals at the NSW State Championships and thank you to all our coaches, age managers, carnival officials and water safety that have made it possible for our Nippers surf sports team to grow and start to produce results that are turning eyes on the beach and most importantly giving kids the skills to become outstanding lifesavers in the future.

Education was once again delivered free to an ever-growing number of members, and across a wide range of causes including Surf rescue, Bronze medallion, First Aid and IRB Driver/crew. It is no mean feat to ensure all our members have the skills they need to keep the community safe and are up to date and proficient. Thank you to our team of Trainers and Assessors and to Willow Forsyth our Director of Education who has also taken on the role at Hunter Branch. Willow has worked tirelessly to streamline education process for not only Stockton and our members but all clubs in the Hunter and I look forward to seeing the benefits as we move forward into the upcoming summer.

Our Nippers program continues to grow in numbers with skill levels continuing to improve across all age groups. This has been reflected in our carnival results and the increased retention numbers we have seen in the program. Thank you to Trevor Upton and all the helpers that allow our nippers to get out there and learn every Sunday it is by far the biggest undertaking of our club but I'm sure you'll agree the most rewarding also.

The year was not without its challenges, most notably the Harbour swim was unable to run due to poor water quality in the harbour after January's rain event. This was a difficult decision to make but I believe the right one under the circumstances in which we faced. Thank you to Port Waratah Coal Services for their support of the event and assistance given after the difficult decision was made not to go ahead. All entries will be honoured in 2026 and we look forward to running what has become a truly iconic event in Newcastle once again.

On the beach front, erosion continues but it is better news with the State government including the funds promised for mass sand nourishment at the last election in the most recent budget and work continuing on establishing suitable sand source. Fingers crossed we will continue to see positive news and sand returned in the not-too-distant future.

Lastly, I would like to take the opportunity to thank and congratulate all the members of the Executive for their work the past year. The modern Surf Life Saving club delivers such a wide range of services and activities to the community and its membership and I am continually inspired by each of you not only delivering in your roles as directors but also contributing huge amounts of time and expertise in other areas of the club. Be it patrols, coaching, education or pouring beers at a function you lead from the front and are an amazing group of people.

As I have stood down as President at our Election of Officers back in May I'd like to once again congratulate Jo Dryden on being elected as the first Female President of Stockton SLSC and thank everyone again for your support over the last 4 years. I'm truly excited for what the future of the club looks like under Jo's leadership and wish the new committee all the best.

# Director of Finance



"It gives me great pleasure to present the 2024/2025 annual financial report of Stockton Surf Life Saving Club for your consideration and acceptance."

I am able to announce that Stockton SLSC made an accounting loss of \$36,262 for the 2024/2025 financial year. This loss needs to consider the amount allocated to depreciation and increase in life saving expenses.

The bank balance decreased by \$16,971 from the start of the 2024/2025 financial year until the end due to an increase in life saving expenses.

In saying this I believe we had a good year because we have purchased a reasonable amount of new equipment for the Education, Life Saving, Surf Sports and Nippers sections of the club.

#### **Other reasons I believe we have had a good year are:**

1. The education to our members has been provided free of charge;
2. We were unable to successfully run the Harbour Swim;
3. Assisted members to attend all required carnivals;
4. Assisted members obtain competition equipment to represent our club; and
5. Purchase of a new Racing Mals and Soft Nipper Boards.

Total income for the year (\$198,644) includes the allocation of funds from Hunter SLS, MOLES, Newcastle City Council, Port Waratah Coal Services, Surf Lifesaving NSW; and Surf Lifesaving Australia which has been allocated for new life saving equipment, training equipment, youth development and new competition equipment.

Expenditure for the year (\$234,906) includes costs for a paid club coach, carnival entry fees, club clothing, gear and equipment, IRB equipment, AGM Report, Financial Audit, etc.

We have also had income and expenditures from running or being involved in more events this year (e.g. Triathlon water safety, Donations, Hall Hires).

In closing I would like to acknowledge the efforts of Stockton SLSC Directors and Management committee for the manner in which they manage the operations of the club.

I would also like to thank all the people involved in making this year such a success even with the external circumstances and restrictions applied to our club and members.

# Director of Lifesaving

"Well another great season has come and gone, and Stockton SLSC demonstrated how adaptable we are as a club".



With great teamwork, working together to patrol our beach, meet our patrolling obligations and maintaining a safe recreation area for the members of the public and our members.

As my 4th year as Director of Lifesaving, this year again we were able to build on our experiences of the previous years and make some more adjustments.

With assistance of Thomas Enright as Vice Club Captain and Nathan Wood as the IRB Captain we managed to perform our duties and commitment to our community with no Patrol Breaches and No lives lost between the flags.

Firstly, I would like to thank all the Patrolling members for your patience, assistance and flexibility throughout the season.

Without your help and assistance, we would not have been able to meet our patrolling obligations without the risk of patrol breaches.

This year we signed a new 2-year Patrol hours agreement which saw some changes to our hours. With less days of 8-hour coverage and extending 4 hours patrols to 5 hours, and during peak periods to 6-hours this dropped our average hours of patrol from 44 hours to 40 hours per patrol member. So the feedback has been positive as we spent less days on Patrol. We also dropped down to 8 patrols and a life members patrol, between us all we patrolled. Approximately 2700hrs, performed 1 major rescue, and several minor rescues, numerous minor first aid assistance and 1 callout Assisting the Hunter branch Duty officer and Marine Rescue in the Hunter river, rescuing a family of 4 who were stranded on a boat that ran aground on an Oyster Bank the night before.

On average each patrolling member was rostered approximately 40 hrs for the season, with several members exceeding 60 hrs. A special mention to Thomas Enright and Billy Bernard who exceeded 200hrs. These members were acknowledged at the presentation for their efforts.



This season with Cyclone Alfred there was flooding on the Far North coast of NSW. SLSNSW called for assistance and Stockton SLSC answered the call and was placed on Standby to assist if needed.

This demonstrates the commitment and professional attitudes of our members and our callout team who are proud to assist as an emergency service. This has been acknowledged by SLS Hunter Branch and SLS NSW.

Patrol awards this year were difficult to decide as you all performed very well.

The 100% Patrol award: Again this year we awarded the Patrolling members who performed their allocated rostered Hours.

Patrol of the Year: This award is always a hard choice with all patrols performing excellently, Patrol of the Year was award to Patrol 8, Patrol Captain Nathan Wood, Tony Wood Thomas Enright and Shelly Nicols

Patrol Person of the Year: Was awarded to Billy Bernard, Besides being an outstanding member of Stockton SLSC, Billy performed in excess of 200hrs Patrolling hours.

Billy performs all his Patrols and helps filling in for other members. Billy can always be found on Sunday mornings preparing the IRB for Nippers water safety. Billy is also in training for his IRB Drivers award.

Billy has assisted in several rescues with Logistic back up, through preparing IRBs, assisting the Branch Duty officer with local knowledge and radio assistance

Billy has been a great asset assisting with repairs and preparing of the IRBs and Patrol equipment and in patrol coverage.

Each year we receive 2 grants from SLSNSW and SLISA, the BSEF grant and the CLEG grant.

BESF grants assisted us with the purchase of 2 new boards, a portable Oxy viva, PFD's, Helmets a several small patrolling items

The CLEG grant assisted the club to purchase vital First aid equipment, Sun protection items and uniforms

This season has seen many challenges, but we got through it. Thank you again for your patience and assistance.

For the new season, 2025-26 I will be stepping down from Director of Life Saving and passing the role onto Thomas Enright.

Thomas has assisted me the last 4 years and it is time for a fresh set of eyes and ideas for the club to evolve.

I have had a rewarding time as Director of Lifesaving with many great opportunities and fond memories.

Thanks again for your assistance.

A full calendar of surf sports events saw the success of our Sunday morning Senior's swim, we were able to hold our Breakwater Swim and Club Championships events and we hosted the Hunter Branch Masters Championships. Our athletes also did a great job of representing our club at carnivals throughout the season, the Hunter/Central Coast and ASRL surf boat series, and Branch, State and Australian Championships.

There are three particular surf sports results that I take pleasure in congratulating on behalf of the club. The first congratulations goes to Will Isedale on winning the Gold medal at the NSW Age Championships in the Under 10 years male Beach Flags. This is the second time in as many

attempts that Will has been successful in this event which is a truly phenomenal result! "Before the start of the season a call went out for those that may be interested in assisting on the beach as an age manager and in the water as water safety".



Information was sent to those that volunteered so that online lessons could be completed before the start. Three new parents signed up to gain their award for age manager. By the end of the season all had completed all tasks relating to the age managers award. Congratulations to all.

Dates were set for those new nippers to come along and ask questions and register. There were impressive numbers on each date. By the time the season started the nipper count was approaching two hundred. The final count registered for the season was two hundred and twenty three, this number compared to the previous season.

As has been conducted over the past couple of seasons, each month consisted of skill days and one competition day. This format stated by parents has been a big factor in why they have registered at Stockton keeping the numbers comparable each season.

Each season all nippers MUST complete a competency skill in the pool before progressing to the open water skill competency. This is conducted in the first month of the season or as nippers join. Each year it is disappointing to see the number of young children that find it difficult to swim a short distance. This puts pressure on the water safety and age managers.

The first day of Nippers was held on the first Sunday after the October long weekend. At the first pool competency swim, good numbers attended in all ages. For the first month we were conducting pool swims as well as conducting beach/water skills.

Once again, the number of new Nippers joining the club has grown from past seasons. It was also pleasing to see those rejoining to further enhance their skills.

This season the number attending carnivals grew to an average of around twenty attendees to each carnival. This training was conducted by a dedicated group of parents and committed parents do water safety. These training sessions are NOT possible if there is no water safety.

This season the coffee club and the Stockton Winter Swimming Club (Jellyblubbers) donated boards for the nippers so that the club can keep updating the gear.

This season each age group parents manned the BBQ with great success. Most weeks the grass around the BBQ area was covered with nippers and parent enjoying something to eat and drink. Thankyou to those that assisted.

Age manager/water safety without your assistance each Sunday nippers would not exist, and I thank you.

The club and I thank the parents for bringing their nippers to the beach each Sunday to learn beach and surf skills to swim in open water.

The season ended with the presentation with all nippers receiving a surf certificate from New South Wales Surf Lifesaving and a pair of swim goggles from the club. Major trophies were awarded to the winners and posted in the newsletter.

Finally I would like to congratulate Drew Heffernan for her selection in the Hunter Branch Interbranch team for the third consecutive season. William Isedale for his NSW State Gold medal in the U10 beach flags. William's U10 Gold was backed up from last season's U9 Gold. This seasons state carnival the club had a nipper Stevie Robinson enter the inclusive competition bring home Gold in the beach flags and sprint.

As the Director of Members Services (Nippers) I would like to thank all that assisted me in making the 2024/25 season another successful season. # Director of Education

“2024/25 was another year in which we watched the beach shrink again.”



Remnants of the 2023 dredging largely prevented further severe beach retreat and dune erosion. Not quite overnight, but in a series of 3 big weather events in 5 weeks, significant beach width was lost in front of the seawalls, beach scraping sand is gone replaced with vertical cliffs, and significant overwash of dunes, seawalls and roads. The Hunter Water toxic dumpsite is exposed again, and their sandbags have begun to collapse. Urban inundation occurred, as the diminished dunes were overtopped by the storm waves.

Annual Proficiency Skills Maintenance ran from October to November. Club assessors turned up to every patrol. We also helped returning members stay current into January, as they returned. As said last year “Keeping skills current for our active members is the lifeblood of our club’s patrols, Nippers’ coaches, and competition teams”. It is also crucial for the safety of our patrol members, when we update

everyone on new standards and refresh key prevention and rescue planning skills. Thank you as always to our assessors that keep the educational lifeblood of our club pumping.

Overall, we trained 14 Bronze members, 2 members attained Cert II Upgrade and 9 SRC members, along with 1 IRB Crew Certificate, 2 Silver Medallion IRB Driver, 2 Facilitator awards, 1 Training Officer IRB and 18 First Aid awards. Members returning after 5 years need to do the full course as they gain the Certificate II (PUA20119). For those with shorter breaks, a gap analysis can be undertaken to bridge to current award standards. The transition pathway for SRC to Bronze rests on doing patrols and upgrading within 2 years. A Bronze course kicked off early in the season, while SRC training largely ran every Sunday for the U13s/U14s. From December onwards, when people were ready, they attended the CVAs.



Every year, the Nippers who get their SRC award demonstrate amazing surf skills. The same can be said for parents who undertake the Bronze with little prior experience. Handling the big yellow rescue boards, with the added weight dynamics of a patient, is a phenomenal skill. Congratulations to all those who demonstrated these specialist skills in sometimes challenging conditions at each of the CVAs. It is not just in the surf, but also on the shore, where our candidates excelled at demonstrating how to gather the resources they need, and how to manage an unconscious patient. Well done! Welcome to a group of people who provide an invisible safety net at our beaches each time you are present – whether on-duty or off.

The strength of a TAF (trainer, assessor, facilitator) team comes from its members expanding their awards. This means we have more flexibility and more trainers. Congratulations to Paul Bernard who gained his Facilitators First Aid, Willow Forsyth who attained her Facilitator Bronze Medallion and to Connor Johansen gaining his trainer award. We look forward in the next season to increasing the TAF group and their award span.

Other courses offered and completed during the year were CPR (HLTAID009), First Aid (HLTAID011), IRB Crew, IRB Driver Silver Medallion, and the Silver Patrol Captains course. Plus, members undertook Age Managers, Officials, Beach Management, and SMAR awards. It is worth mentioning, that a number of our TAF team also are duty officers for Hunter Branch, and members of Stockton's call-out team. Thank you again to the parents who undertook their Age Manager and Officials training. These awards are the backbone of running Nippers and Carnivals – so many others benefit from your generosity.

Stockton hosted a number of CVAs when surf conditions were too extreme at other Hunter branch beaches, or an additional CVA was needed at the end of the season, so candidates from other clubs and ours had a chance to be assessed.

Your SLS Members Portal account has a quick and easy snapshot of expiring awards. Should you have any questions regarding your awards status, please ask one of the members of the education TAF team.

Without the expert support of the TAF team, the training programs wouldn't happen. Special thanks to Trevor Upton, Ros McMahon, Wayne Findlay, Noel Burns, Paul Bernard, and Brendon Ryman for the time and effort they put into training and assessing members this year. Welcome to Connor Johansen. Thank you to Nathan Wood and Tom Enright for the effort and skill they put into training IRB crews and drivers.

And finally, a thank you to all the people who have trained and kept current as Bronzies and SRCs, because you are invisible protection for beachgoers inside and outside the flags. Your stories of rescues and preventative actions are evidence of drownings avoided.

I am looking forward to season 2025/26 and hoping the government delivered on the promised mass sand nourishment by this time in 2026.

# Season Highlights

## BEACH EROSION

This year, after many years of advocacy by the Stockton community and local clubs, the Extended Stockton CMP has been finalised, ready for approval by City of Newcastle councillors in August and then the NSW Government. Mass sand nourishment, supported by regular sand top-ups is the core of this plan that received 90% community support. The NSW Government also announced its election promise of \$21.5mn in funding was put into the recent budget.

These are significant milestones that set a NSW precedent in best practices. And deeply worthy of celebration. Many people have worked tirelessly toward this - from both the community and government.

However, the project program being delivered by the NSW Government's DCCEEW isn't finalised. The timeline for the project steps - environmental impact statement, mining licence, dumping approvals, dredge contract and sand dumping program - has not been publicly released.

Critical protection was provided by City of Newcastle's sand scraping program this past year against moderate sized storms. It proved the value of mass sand in reducing rates of erosion compared to the 'armoured' sea wall sections which now play host to ever deepening holes under their leading offshore edges.

A fast-tracked timeline for mass sand nourishment is the critical deliverable by the responsible NSW Government departments. Crucial for a beach that is now classified as extremely vulnerable. It's about more than beach amenity; this is about protecting public and private assets from further erosion, and from storm surge inundation.

Now if not the time to slack off - the race is not yet won. East coast lows the size of the Pasha Bulker storm will return. What is needed is the mass sand nourishment and ongoing top-ups first to put us on the path toward a resilient beach.

## HARBOUR SWIM 2025 - CANCELLED

The difficult decision to cancel our iconic Australia Day Harbour Swim was made on January 22nd after relevant authorities assessed the water quality as very poor. In the week leading up to the swim, storms and extended power outages to critical infrastructure in the Lower Hunter significantly affected water quality in Newcastle Harbour.

While it was extremely disappointing for our local community, the open swim community and our club, safety was paramount. Thank you to Port Waratah Coal Services for their continued sponsorship of the event and particularly for their support this year despite the event being cancelled. Registrations will be honoured in next year's event for those who had registered.

## PRESENTATION NIGHT & MAJOR AWARD WINNERS

Our annual presentation night was held on Saturday 31st May 2025 at the surf club. The presentation night allows us to reflect on the depth of talent in our club as well as the skill and commitment provided by our patrolling and training members. It's a chance to celebrate the successes and thank everyone for their contribution to a successful season. # The origin of our club logo



The Stockton Surf Life Saving Club logo, with its characteristic red circle enclosing the iconic surf reel on a blue background, has adorned with pride our clubrooms, competition gear, clothing and publications for 60 years.

A simple design instantly recognisable, it has been a constant emblem for our club over such a long period of change and progress. Where did it come from?

It seems that as Club secretary in the early 1960s, Ross Evans (now a Life Member) conceived a design to feature on the first page of the annual report (then a collection of typewritten pages photocopied and stapled together). He then obtained some white t-shirts in various sizes with the new logo screen printed in Club colours on them for sale to members. These proved popular so the committee decided that metal lapel badges should be ordered. Cloth embroidered patches were also sourced to be sewn onto track tops, footy jumpers etc. Even a set of car stickers was produced (2 shillings each to members).

There was no thought at the time that this manifestation of Club pride would endure for 60 years, embraced by the men and women of our Club and the boys and girls of our Nippers' contingent.

Many thanks to Ross Evans for designing this enduring symbol of our club and for recounting its history.

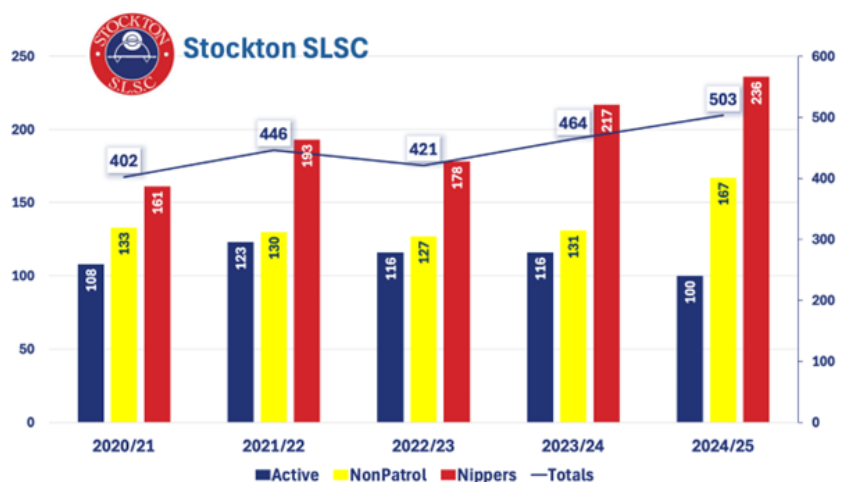
# Member listings

### 1. Introduction

The financial report covers Stockton Surf Life Saving Club Inc as an individual entity. Stockton Surf Life Saving Club Inc is a not-for-profit Company, registered and domiciled in Australia.

The principal activities of the Company for the year ended 31 May 2025 were operating a surf life saving club.

The financial report was authorised for issue by those charged with governance on 04 July 2025.

Comparatives are consistent with prior years, unless otherwise stated.

### 2. Basis of preparation

In the opinion of those charged with governance, the Company is not a reporting entity since there are unlikely to exist users of the financial statements who are not able to command the preparation of reports tailored so as to satisfy specifically all of their information needs. These special purpose financial statements have been prepared to meet the reporting requirements of the *Australian Charities and Not-for-profits Commission Act 2012*.

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the recognition and measurement requirements of the Australian Accounting Standards and Accounting Interpretations, and the disclosure requirements of AASB 101 *Presentation of Financial Statements*, AASB 107 *Statement of Cash Flows*, AASB 108 *Accounting Policies, Changes in Accounting Estimates and Errors* and AASB 1054 *Australian Additional Disclosures*.

The financial statements and material accounting policies all comply with the recognition and measurement requirements in Australian Accounting Standards.

The financial statements have been prepared on an accruals basis and are based on historical costs modified, where applicable, by the measurement at fair value of selected non-current assets, financial assets and financial liabilities.

Material accounting policy information is consistent with prior reporting periods unless otherwise stated.

### 3. Material accounting policy information

#### a. Income tax

The association is exempt from income tax under Division 50 of the *Income Tax Assessment Act 1997*.

#### b. Borrowing costs

All borrowing costs are recognised as an expense in the period in which they are incurred.

#### c. Goods and services tax (GST)

Revenue, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of goods and services tax (GST), except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Taxation Office (ATO).

## 3. Material accounting policy information (continued)

### c. Goods and services tax (GST) (continued)

Receivables and payable are stated inclusive of GST.

Cash flows in the statement of cash flows are included on a gross basis and the GST component of cash flows arising from investing and financing activities which is recoverable from, or payable to, the taxation authority is classified as operating cash flows.

### d. Financial instruments

Financial instruments are recognised initially on the date that the association becomes party to the contractual provisions of the instrument.

On initial recognition, all financial instruments are measured at fair value plus transaction costs (except for instruments measured at fair value through profit or loss where transaction costs are expensed as incurred).

#### i. Financial assets

All recognised financial assets are subsequently measured in their entirety at either amortised cost or fair value, depending on the classification of the financial assets.

##### 1) Classification

On initial recognition, the association classifies its financial assets into the following categories, those measured at:

- amortised cost
- fair value through profit or loss - FVTPL
- fair value through other comprehensive income - equity instrument (FVOCI - equity)
- fair value through other comprehensive income - debt investments (FVOCI - debt)

Financial assets are not reclassified subsequent to their initial recognition unless the association changes its business model for managing financial assets.

##### 2) Amortised cost

The association's financial assets measured at amortised cost comprise trade and other receivables and cash and cash equivalents in the statement of financial position.

Subsequent to initial recognition, these assets are carried at amortised cost using the effective interest rate method less provision for impairment.

Interest income, foreign exchange gains or losses and impairment are recognised in profit or loss. Gain or loss on derecognition is recognised in profit or loss.

Impairment of trade receivables and contract assets have been determined using the simplified approach in AASB 9 which uses an estimation of lifetime expected credit losses.

##### 4) Other financial assets measured at amortised cost

Impairment of other financial assets measured at amortised cost are determined using the expected credit loss model in AASB 9. On initial recognition of the asset, an estimate of the expected credit losses for the next 12 months is recognised. Where the asset has experienced significant increase in credit risk then the lifetime losses are estimated and recognised.

## 4. Critical accounting estimates and judgements

The responsible persons make estimates and judgements during the preparation of these financial statements regarding assumptions about current and future events affecting transactions and balances.

These estimates and judgements are based on the best information available at the time of preparing the financial statements, however as additional information is known then the actual results may differ from the estimates.

The significant estimates and judgements made have been described below.

### a. Key estimates - impairment of property, plant and equipment

The association assesses impairment at the end of each reporting period by evaluating conditions specific to the association that may be indicative of impairment triggers. Recoverable amounts of relevant assets are reassessed using value-in-use calculations which incorporate various key assumptions.

## 5. Revenue and other income

### a. Accounting policy

#### i. Revenue from contracts with customers

Revenue is recognised on a basis that reflects the transfer of control of promised goods or services to customers at an amount that reflects the consideration the association expects to receive in exchange for those goods or services.

Generally, the timing of the payment for sale of goods and rendering of services corresponds closely to the timing of satisfaction of the performance obligations, however where there is a difference, it will result in the recognition of a receivable, contract asset or contract liability.

### a. Accounting policy (continued)

#### i. Revenue from contracts with customers (continued)

None of the revenue streams of the association have any significant financing terms as there is less than 12 months between receipt of funds and satisfaction of performance obligations.

#### ii. Grant revenue

Where grant income arises from an agreement which is enforceable and contains sufficiently specific performance obligations then the revenue is recognised when control of each performance obligations is satisfied.

Grant income arising from non-enforceable contracts or those without sufficiently specific performance obligations is recognised on receipt unless it relates to capital grants which meet certain criteria.

Enforceable capital grants received to enable the association to acquire or construct an item of property, plant and equipment to identified specifications which will be controlled by the entity are recognised as revenue as and when the obligation to construct or purchase is completed.

- For construction projects, this is generally as the construction progresses in accordance with costs incurred since this is deemed to be the most appropriate measure of the completeness of the construction project as there is no profit margin.
- For acquisitions of assets, the revenue is recognised when the asset is acquired and controlled by the entity.

#### iii. Other income

Other income is recognised on an accruals basis when the association is entitled to it.

#### iv. Volunteer services

No amounts are included in the financial statements for services donated by volunteers.
